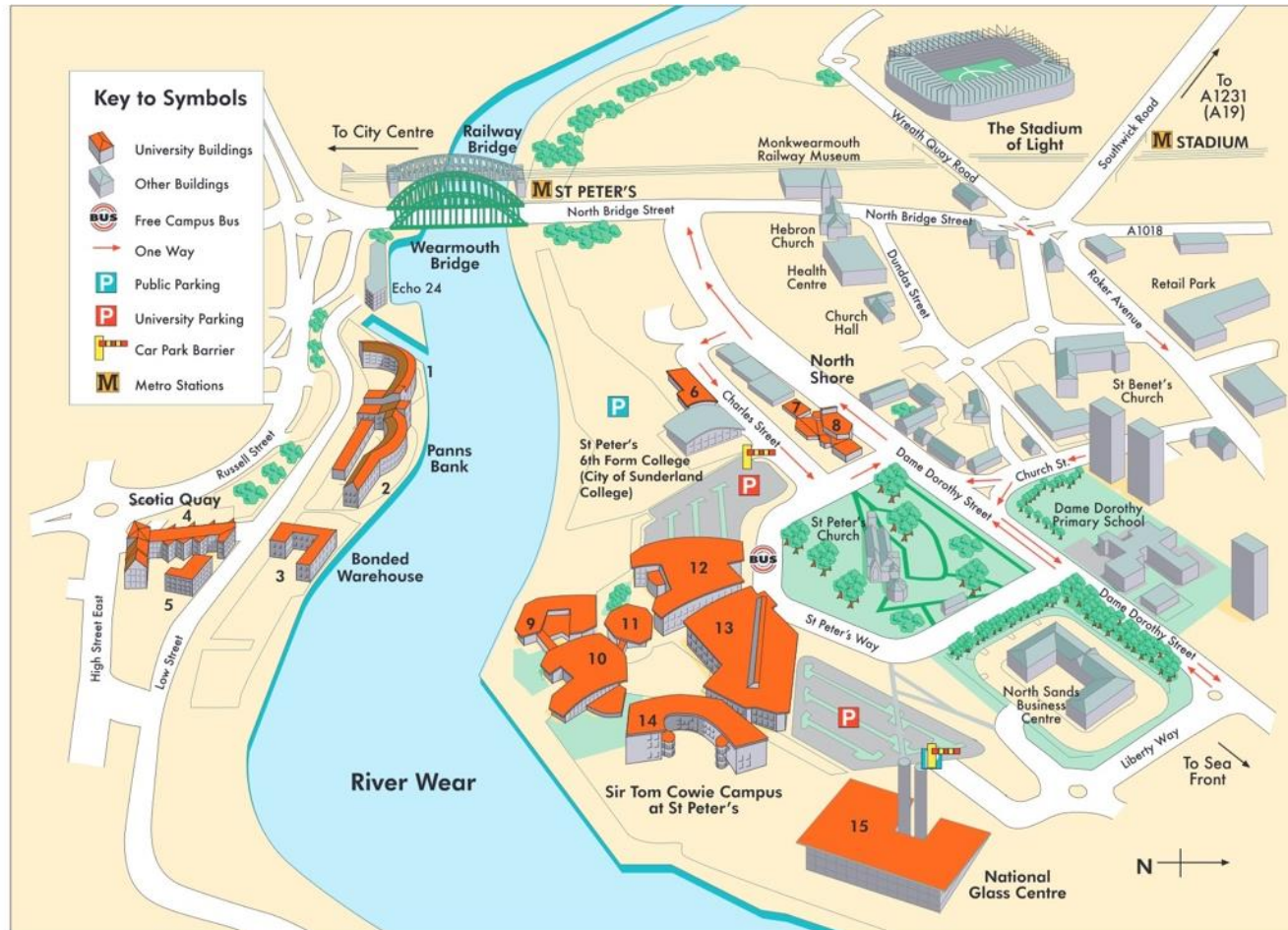

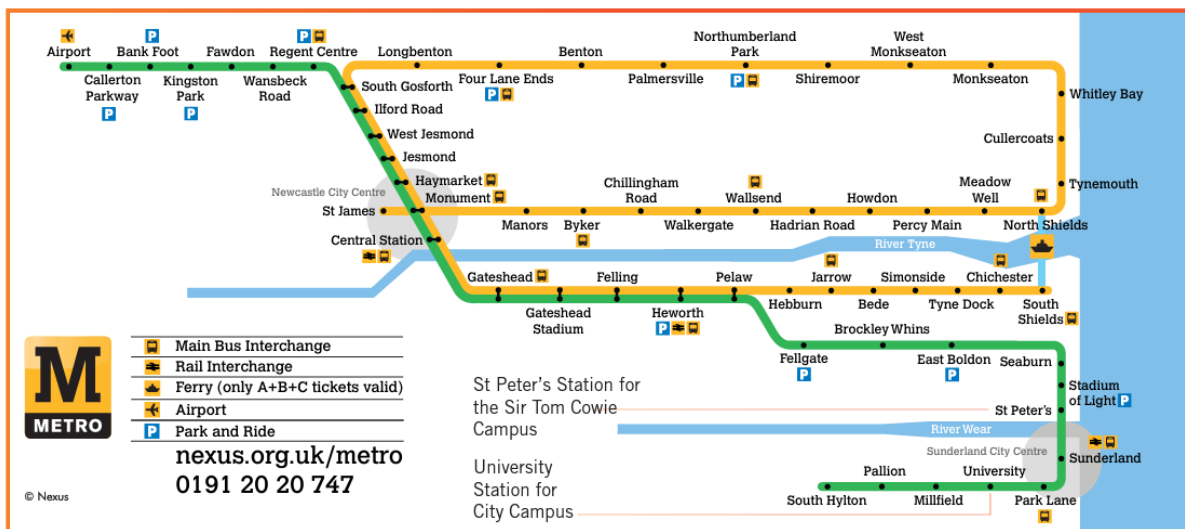

Sunderland: activities will be taking place in the Sir Tom Cowie Lecture Theatre (#11) and the Reg Vardy Centre (#12) on the map above. Registration and refreshments/lunch will be taking place in The Prospect Building (#10) on the map above.

Getting to Newcastle or Sunderland from Newcastle International Airport:

The Metro system provides a regular service between Newcastle Airport and the cities of Newcastle-upon-Tyne and Sunderland. You will require an all zones (A, B, and C) Metro ticket to get from the airport to both campuses, and vice versa. Times between the airport and Newcastle, 'Haymarket' (25 - 30 mins) or 'Manors' (changing at 'Monument' from the 'green' Airport train to the 'yellow' North Coast and South Shields loop line at c.30 - 35 mins), and Airport to St. Peter's (Sunderland) (c. 50 mins to an hour), and Newcastle to St. Peter's (Sunderland) (around 30 mins).



Getting to Northumbria University's City Campus East ...

... **by Metro**: please travel to 'Manors' or 'Haymarket' stops ('Manors' is closest to CCE1 where the day will begin).

... **by mainline train**: travel to Newcastle Central Station: from there you can walk (10 minutes), or take a bus (from bus stop H on Clayton Street, take the number 62 bus to New Bridge Street. This will drop you just outside New Bridge Street Accommodation and just a 2 minute walk from the Business & Law Building) or taxi (for the latter ask for Northumbria University's CCE1 Business and Law School building).

Getting to Sunderland St Peter's Campus ...

... **by Metro**: From St. Peter's Metro station it is an 8-10 minute walk to Sir Tom Cowie Campus. Head along Dame Dorothy Street, turn right into St. Peter's Way and cut through buildings 12 and 13 on map to arrive at building 10. By Metro - Newcastle Central is 25 minutes and Newcastle Airport 50 minutes.

... **by car**: head East along A1231 and simply follow the brown directional signs for National Glass Centre which is located within The Sir Tom Cowie Campus at St. Peter's. If using SatNav enter Sir Tom Cowie Campus at St Peter's: SR6 ODD.

Parking

Northumbria's City Campus West:

There is no parking facility at City Campus East, but there are 24 visitor/transitional spaces located in the Squires Annexe car park (bays 1-14 and 19-29) in City Campus West. This car park is located between Squires Annexe and Sandyford Buildings and is accessed via Day Street. Address: Squires Annexe, NE1 8QE. Travelling West on Sandyford Road, turn left onto Day Street. Take the first right and this will take you into Squires Annexe car park. If you are travelling from the City Centre, you will need to go past Day Street to a mini roundabout and double back. Parking here is by pre-arranged permit: please contact matthew.potter@northumbria.ac.uk by midday of Tuesday 13 June so a permit can be arranged for you. You will be issued a booking confirmation email and do not need anything else, however, you should display a note in your car showing the permit ID (which will be attached to the confirmation email).

Sunderland St. Peter's Campus:

There are 50 parking permits available for free parking at Sir Tom Cowie Campus at St. Peter's. These can be collected at registration and displayed on the dashboard in your car. The car park is a 2-minute walk to the registration building.
